


Figure 1. Three-year Sawtimber Price Trends

## STUMPAGE PRICE TRENDS

Overall, the South saw declines in average stumpage prices during this quarter; however, in Arkansas stumpage prices saw modest increases in every product class except hardwood pulpwood which decreased by 7% from last quarter.


US housing starts and building construction were down slightly compared to this time last year. Pine pulpwood prices again saw a small increase this quarter and only declined by 1% year over year. Oak sawtimber prices saw an increase of 19% year over year and slightly increase of 2% since last quarter. Pine sawtimber prices have remained relatively flat since 2022. Oak sawtimber prices have increased steadily since hitting a low during the 2Q 2023.

In mill news, American Kraft Paper Industries purchased the Twin Rivers Paper mill in Pine Bluff, Arkansas during this quarter. Also, Pactiv Evergreen Inc. has signed a definitive agreement to sell its mill in Pine Bluff, Arkansas to Suzano S.A.
