
The Arkansas Timber Harvest Report displays Arkansas timber severance tax data as reported from the Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration. Timber severance taxes are collected, reported, and remitted by each primary processor of Arkansas timber. It is computed based on the weight determined the last time timber is weighed prior to undergoing the first primary processing after severance. Severance totals can be submitted one of three ways: monthly (by the 25th day of the following month), quarterly, or annually. Reporting time frame varies by primary processor. 

TIMBER HARVEST TRENDS

The third quarter of 2024 saw a small increase in total severances compared to this time last year. Arkansas reported a total timber severance of 6.0 million tons during this quarter, representing a 1% increase year/year. The largest increase was observed in non-pine wood, which increased by 7% statewide year/year while pine had little to no change.

In North Arkansas, severance of non-pine species increased by 15% year/year. In South Arkansas, changes were more modest, with no change in pine wood and an 5% increase in non-pine species compared to the same period last year.

From January 1, 2024, to the close of the third quarter, the timber severance in the state totaled over 15.7 million tons.
