

## ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE IN GENERAL TECHNOLOGY

Students attending UAM-CTC may enter a program that allows them to earn an Associate of Applied Science degree. The courses required for the AAS will be offered on the UAM-CTC campus.

**DEGREE OPTION 1:** A student completes all the requirements for a one-year technical certificate. A student must also complete the required 15 hours of general education courses, plus additional elective hours (either technical or non-technical courses) for a total of **60** credit hours.

**DEGREE OPTION 2:** A student completes 24 hours in a major technical area and 21 hours in the technical core of support courses from other related technical disciplines **and** completes 15 hours of required general education courses. With the approval of the academic advisor or unit head and the Vice-Chancellor of Academic Affairs, the student may select courses from one or more technical disciplines and develop a coherent technical program that will prepare him/her for employment in occupational and technical fields.
