Dear Students and Project Directors,

The Southeast Arkansas Regional Science and Engineering Fair (SEARSF) will be held Thursday, March 10, 2022. Please visit the website of Society for Science & the Public to view the updated rules and regulations. All necessary forms, for you and your students, are available at our website. Some of these forms must be printed, filled out, and mailed in; others must be submitted online. Please read the rules carefully, and make sure each student project package is complete and submitted properly.

1. To comply with the State and the International Science Fairs, all projects must be reviewed and approved by the Southeast Arkansas Regional Science Fair Scientific Review Committee (SRC) prior to competitions.
2. To ensure your project qualifies to compete: **ALL THE RESEARCH PAPERS AND COMPLETED FORMS AND OTHER REQUIRED MATERIAL MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE DUE DATE: **March 1, 2022****. See the Format, Eligibility, and Application Process for the submission methods of the student's project package.
3. It is highly recommended that you print all the forms needed for your project and read all instructions for each form carefully and make sure you complete and include all the required dates and signatures.
4. If a reviewed project is found incomplete, the student, teacher, and /or adult sponsor will be contacted to submit additional or missing information (forms, signature, etc.) So, it is important to include contact information for student, teacher, and adult sponsor (Email, telephone number.)
5. A project entry fee of \$5.00 is required for each individual or team project. Please make the checks payable to: UAM Southeast Arkansas Regional Science Fair.
