## **DIMENSIONS:**

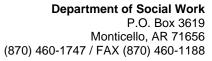
**Knowledge:** "theoretical perspectives drawn from multiple disciplines for understanding human behavior in the social environment" (Miley & DuBois, 2019, p.415). Disciplines include, but are not limited to, liberal arts, philosophy and history, field of practice, theoretical constructs and practice models, legislation and social policies, cultural influences, research, and knowledge of self.

**Values:** "implicit and explicit ideas about what is ideal, "good," and preferred, which translates into norms and guidelines for behavior" (Miley & DuBois, 2019, p.422). Social Work requires the ability to identify and separate personal and professional values, as well as identifying, addressing, and resolving personal biases, and ethical dilemmas as they occur. Finally Social work required the understanding and application of the core values of the profession.

**Skills:** Social Work requires a wide variety of broad skills including but not limited to, applying theory to practice, application of the Generalist Intervention Model, intervention at all service levels (micro/mezzo/macro), developing and maintaining professional working relationships, oral and written communication, interviewing and documentation, cultural awareness and competence, policy analysis, becoming a proficient consumer and practitioner of research, use of social media and other current technology, and time management (Miley & DuBois, 2019).

Cognitive and Affective Processes: (includes critical thinking, affective reactions, and exercise of judgement) (CSWE, 2015).

- ➤ Critical thinking is an intellectual, disciplined process of conceptualizing, analyzing, evaluating, and synthesizing multiple sources of information generated by observation, reflection and reasoning (CSWE, 2015).
- Affective reactions refer to the way in which our emotions influence our thinking and subsequently our behavior (CSWE, 2015).
- Exercise of judgement is the capacity to perceive and discern multiple sources to form an opinion (CSWE, 2015).



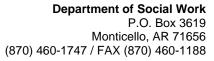
