## Fall 2024 Refunds

REMINDER: You must be attending classes (or participating online) as of the semester enrollment census date on September 5th, to be eligible for federal, state and institutional financial aid programs. Attendance (participation) in an online course includes submission of an academic assignment, participation in an online discussion about academic matters, and contact with an instructor to ask questions about an academic subject. Attendance does not include logging into an online class without participation, or academic advising only. Regular class attendance throughout the entire semester is essential. Direct Loan eligibility requires at least half-time enrollment and attendance at all times (6 hours undergraduate/ 3 hours graduate). Students who completely withdraw or stop attending classes prior to the end of the semester may be required to return a portion of federal or state aid funds received. Visit the Financial Aid Office in Harris Hall, Room 300, or contact 870-460-1050 before dropping any classes.

## Week of September 23rd

- Loan refunds (minus institutional charges) available.
- Pell Grants and other aid awarded (minus institutional charges). Aid received and applied to the student's account by September 13<sup>th</sup> will be included in this refund. Institutional scholarships are non-refundable.

## Week of October 21st

• Loan refunds (minus institutional charges) from the second disbursement of Fall only loans available.

Aid must be received and applied to the student's account by October 11<sup>th</sup> to be included in this refund. Institutional scholarships are non-refundable.

The Scheduled Disbursement Date displayed in WeevilNet is the earliest date that financial aid funds can be processed -- it is <u>not</u> a refund date. Refunds will be made available by the Cashier's Office beginning with the week of September 23rd. You may sign up for Direct Deposit through your WeevilNet account. If you do not enroll in Direct Deposit, a refund check will be mailed to you if eligible. Loan disbursements to first-time borrowers are subject to a federally required 30-day hold. Institutional scholarships are not refundable.

Funds may not be disbursed for the following reasons:

- Student has not finalized their registration on WeevilNet
- Direct Loan Master Promissory Note (MPN) not completed
- Direct Loan Entrance Counseling not completed
- Student is not enrolled or failed to begin attendance in enough credit hours to receive aid (Loans require at least half-time enrollment: 6 hours undergraduate/ 3 hours graduate)
- Student is provisionally admitted
- Student has outstanding items on "To Do List"

Refer to your WeevilNet To Do List for outstanding items to be done. Direct Loan MPN and Entrance Counseling (2 separate items) are completed electronically (use the link below = FSA id required) and the results must be received by UAM from the U.S. Department of Education before loans can be disbursed.
